Registration is now open for Session One on June 5, "Impact on Long-Term Care and Medical Decision-Making." Speaking will be Dr. David Barile, Founder and Chief Medical Officer of <u>Goals of Care Coalition of</u> <u>NJ</u> (GOCCNJ) [pictured, left]; Laurie Facciarossa Brewer, <u>NJ's Long-Term Care Ombudsman</u> [center], and Gwen Orlowski, Executive Director, <u>Disability Rights NJ</u>.

Dr. Barile will discuss the NJ Practitioner Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment (POLST) form and its importance for at-risk people. A NJ POLST form can be downloaded at <u>goalsofcare.org</u>.

Laurie Facciarossa Brewer and Gwen Orlowski will address the <u>impact of the ongoing COVID-19 crisis on</u> <u>long-term care residents and their families</u>, providing details on how their respective organizations and other advocacy groups have responded. They will also be highlighting innovative practices and collaborations, as well as outlining broader policy changes needed to avert future crises.
