Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Project Director Charles Clarkson, Esq., joins host Cathy Rowe, DrPH, to caution viewers about the importance of reviewing Medicare options during Medicare Open Enrollment on Episode 122 of Aging Insights TV. He also warns about scams.
